Review of Previous Year's Spending - Impact Summary 2024-2025

Achievements

- Increased participation in extra-curricular sport from 60% to 70%.
- Greater attendance at inter-school competitions.
- Improved confidence amongst teaching staff delivering PE.
- Expanded range of sports clubs offered to pupils.
- Increased engagement of disadvantaged and SEND pupils.

Areas for Development

- Increase participation rates amongst less active pupils.
- Further improve swimming attainment outcomes.
- Expand leadership opportunities through sports ambassador roles.

Swimming and Water Safety
